Cowgirls and Sooners

Oklahoma State's women's basketball team (21-4 overall, 9-3 Big 12) will travel to Norman, Okla., to take on Oklahoma (19-5, 9-3) in the second installment of the Bedlam Series on Saturday at 1 p.m. The Cowgirls are fresh off a 71-66 win over Texas on Wednesday, while the Sooners are coming off a 68-65 triumph at Kansas State during the midweek.

Game 411

OSU will be in search of its 10th league win, which would match its previous best in Big 12 play set during the 1997-98 season. Saturday's game will feature the top two scoring offenses in the Big 12 as OSU ranks first (77.8 ppg) and OU checks in at No. 2 (74.8 ppg). The contest will also feature the league's top two scorers in Andrea Riley (22.5 ppg) and Courtney Paris (18.0 ppg).

About Oklahoma

Oklahoma enters Saturday's contest having won eight of its last nine games. The Sooners have won five consecutive home games and have won 10 of 11 overall inside the Lloyd Noble Center. Baylor has been the only team to emerge victorious from Norman after its 84-73 win on Jan. 20. OU features the nation's top rebounder in Courtney Paris (14.8 rpg). Paris is also sixth in the nation in blocked shots at 3.2 rejections per game. As a team, OU ranks first nationally with its +13.7 rebounding margin. Like OSU, the Sooners have used the same starting five in all but one game this season.

Last Time vs. Oklahoma

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) -With the way Andrea Riley kept scoring, No. 6 Oklahoma tried just about everything to slow her down. Even the kind of double-teams the Sooners normally see deployed against Courtney Paris. None of them worked. Riley scored a career-high 45 points and No. 25 Oklahoma State ended its longest losing streak ever in the Bedlam rivalry by knocking off Oklahoma 82-63 on Saturday night. With the teams both in the Top 25 for the first time ever in the 80-game series, Riley and the Cowgirls (14-1, 2-0 Big 12) were in control from the beginning. Riley scored all 14 of Oklahoma State's points during one second-half stretch, extending the lead to 57-38 with a 3-pointer from the left wing. The lead reached as many as 23 at one point. Riley got both of Oklahoma's point guards in deep foul trouble with drives to the basket and was equally deadly from long range, going 4-for-7 from 3-point range. Late in the game, Oklahoma (10-3, 1-1) tried to double-team the speedy guard as she brought the ball upcourt but it only resulted in more fouls 30 feet away from the basket. By the time the first 2 1/2 minutes of the second half had passed, Riley had sent Oklahoma's Danielle Robinson and Jenna Plumley to the bench with four fouls apiece. Sooners coach Sherri Coale said she didn't come in with a Plan C. Riley's 45 points were the most ever scored by a Cowgirls player at Gallagher-Iba Arena and the second-most in school history, behind Donna Ridling's 51 against Tulsa in 1978. Danielle Green posted 17 points and a career-best 12 rebounds for Oklahoma State. That had been the case for most of Oklahoma's 17-game winning streak against Oklahoma State, which included wins by double figures in their last 11 meetings. Not this time. With the crowd behind them, the Cowgirls sped out to a 9-0 lead and were never really challenged on the way to their first Bedlam win since March 2, 1999.

The Series

The Sooners lead the overall series with a 45-35 mark. OSU's 82-63 win in Stillwater earlier this season halted OU's 17-game winning streak in the series. OSU last swept the season series with its in-state rival in 1998, capping a six-game winning streak against the Sooners. OSU's 76-54 win on Feb. 7, 1998 was also its last victory in Norman. OU holds a 24-11 advantage all-time at home in the series.

What 2 Watch 4

Saturday's contest will be televised by Fox Sports Net with Kevin Eschenfelder and Brenda Van Lengen serving as the talent ... a win would be OSU's sixth Big 12 road win this season ... the Cowgirls' five road wins are already their most in league play since the formation of the Big 12.

Budke Nabs 400 Against Texas

OSU's 71-66 win over Texas on Feb. 20 provided an individual milestone for head coach Kurt Budke as it represented his 400th career win. Budke began his career with a 47-15 mark at Allen County Community College before closing out his junior college tenure with a 226-16 mark at Trinity Valley. Overall, he compiled a 273-31 (.898) mark at the JUCO level before moving on to Louisiana Tech where he tallied an 80-16 mark in three seasons. In his third season at OSU, he has led the Cowgirls to a 47-37 mark.

Balanced Attack = Success

Even with the Big 12's top scorer in Andrea Riley, balance has been the key to OSU's offensive success this season. In OSU's 21 wins this season, at least three players have scored in double figures 16 times and at least four players have hit the mark on 12 occasions. In four of the last five wins, the Cowgirls have had four (Colorado, Texas), five (Baylor) and six players (Nebraska) in double figures. OSU's 92 points against the Huskers are its most against a Big 12 foe since scoring 92 against Texas A&M at the 2002 Big 12 tourney. That game also marked the last time six Cowgirls reached double figures against a Big 12 team.

Danielle Green Honored For Work Off The Court

Danielle Green was recognized recently for taking care of business away from basketball. The Philadelphia, Pa., native was named to the 2007-08 Big 12 Winter Sports Good Works Team, which recognizes the community service efforts of Big 12 student-athletes. She was also named an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District first-team selection by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and is now eligible to be selected as an Academic All-American.

Riley Named Naismith, Wooden Semifinalist

Andrea Riley was among 31 players named to the 2008 Naismith Trophy midseason list as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The list of 31 will be trimmed to four finalists in February with the Naismith Trophy winner being announced April 7 at the 2008 NCAA Final Four in Tampa. Riley was also named one of 20 midseason candidates for the John R. Wooden Award. More than 300 voters will vote on the award, which is given to the most outstanding female collegiate basketball player in the nation. The 2008 ceremony will be held in Los Angeles the weekend of April 11-12.

Smith Developing Into Double Trouble For Opponents

After recording five double-doubles as a freshman, junior Shaunte' Smith did not tally No. 6 until scoring a career-high 21 points and grabbing 13 rebounds at Colorado. She did not wait long for No. 7, scoring 10 points and pulling 16 rebounds in OSU's upset win over Baylor the following game. Smith tallied her eighth double-double with 14 points and a career-high 17 rebounds in OSU's win over Texas. The Oklahoma City native now ranks 10th on the school's all-time double-double list. In addition, she ranks among the school's all-time rebounding leaders with 544, placing her 13th in OSU history.

Chart Watching

Several Cowgirls are moving up the school's all-time career lists in several categories.

- Danielle Green has 41 career blocks, placing her in a tie for 15th place and one behind 14th place.
- Maria Cordero has 38 career blocks placing her 17th and three behind 15th place.
- Andrea Riley ranks 18th with her 947 career points and is two points shy of 17th place.
- Riley's 135 steals rank 12th and is one shy of 11th place.
- Riley's 253 assists rank 12th and are four shy of the No. 11 position

Hardeman Dials In From Distance

Taylor Hardeman has caught fire from the 3-point line in conference play and has continued her climb up the school's all-time chart. The junior has hit at least two 3-pointers in nine of her last 14 games, including a 6-of-8 performance at Texas and a 5-of-10 effort at Texas Tech. Her effort against the Longhorns matched her career high set against Iowa State as a freshman and also tied the school's single-game record. Hardeman hit four treys at Nebraska, making her the sixth player in school history to hit the century mark for career threes. She is currently at 106 for her career and just five away from moving into the No. 2 spot on OSU's career list.

Riley Comes Up Big When It Matters Most

Andrea Riley's ability to deliver in the clutch has been evident in Big 12 play. The sophomore scored six of OSU's final 12 points down the stretch to preserve its win at Kansas, before pouring in 37 points in the second half against Oklahoma. At Texas A&M, Riley scored the squad's last five points to secure a three-point win. Against Texas, Riley scored 12 of her 21 points in the final 3:31 to help fend off UT's late rally.

Big Country, Jr.

A well-known nickname in OSU basketball circles has found its way to the women's side as sophomore center Megan Byford has been dubbed "Country" by her teammates. Former Cowboy All-American center Bryant Reeves, who hails from Gans, Okla. (pop. 208) made the moniker a household name on his way to leading OSU to the Final Four in 1995. A native of Bray, Okla. (pop. 1,035), Byford recorded her first career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds against Central Arkansas.

Green Rounding Back Into Form

After being slowed early on due to injury, Danielle Green has regained the form that saw her earn honorable mention All-Big 12 honors last season. The senior produced her best outing of the season against Oklahoma with her second double-double of the year. Once again, Green finds herself among the team leaders in several statistical categories, ranking second in scoring, steals, assists and rebounding.

Ranking Riley

The Cowgirls have played 12 games against Top 25 competition over the past two seasons and Andrea Riley has improved each time out. Riley has been in double figures in the last nine games, including a 20-point showing against Bowling Green in the NCAA Tournament and her 45-point effort against Oklahoma. Riley is averaging 19.1 points over those 12 games.

Road Warriors

OSU's win at Texas Tech was its fifth road win in league play this season, surpassing the school's previous high since the formation of the Big 12. The Cowgirls' previous high of four road wins was achieved in both the 1997-98 and the 2006-07 seasons.

Cowgirls Reach 20-win mark

OSU recorded its 20th win at Texas Tech, marking the ninth 20-win campaign in school history. The win also gave the Cowgirls their first consecutive 20-win seasons since posting a 23-9 mark 1992-93 and a 20-9 record in 1993-94. Reaching the 20-win mark in Game 23 marked the fastest the squad has reached the mark.

Riley Getting It Done Defensively

In addition to her offensive prowess, Andrea Riley has also added her name to the school's all-time steals list with 135 through 55 career games to rank 12th. As a freshman, Riley tallied 60 steals to tie for the 13th-best single-season total. She is once again wreaking havoc on the opposition with her 3.0 steals per game, ranking her tops in the Big 12 and 22nd nationally.

For What It's Worth

Here are a few numbers to serve as food for thought. In the latest edition of Charlie Creme's bracketology on ESPN.com, the Cowgirls are listed as a No. 3 seed in the Spokane Regional. CollegeRPI.com has the Cowgirls listed as a No. 4 seed in the Oklahoma City Regional. Also, the initial recruiting rankings are out and OSU's 2008 class has been ranked as the 31st-best in the country by All-Star Girls Report.

Defending Their Home Turf

The Cowgirls are currently 13-2 at home this season, matching their highest win total in school history. On the same day the New England Patriots closed out their regular season at 16-0, OSU wrapped up its home non-conference slate undefeated for the second consecutive year and has followed with a 4-2 record in league play. Last year, the Cowgirls finished 13-4 overall inside Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Riley Named Big 12 Player of the Week

For the second time this season, Andrea Riley was named the Big 12 Player of the Week after her conference-opening performances against Kansas and Oklahoma. She produced a 45-point outburst, 37 of which came in the second half, to help the Cowgirls snap their 17-game losing streak against the Sooners. Her point total was the second-highest in school history and was the most points ever scored by a Cowgirl inside Gallagher-Iba Arena. Riley's scoring outburst is also the top point total in the nation.

Second Half Surge

The Cowgirls have made a habit of responding to head coach Kurt Budke's halftime speeches this season as they have scored 1,041 points in the second halves of their contests as opposed to 905 in the first period. OSU has gone over the 50-point mark in the second period on five occasions as well.

High-Octane Offense Fueling Early Success

The Cowgirls are lighting up the scoreboard this season, averaging 77.8 points per game to rank eighth nationally. OSU is also among the nation's best in scoring margin at +19.4, ranking fourth. Andrea Riley is currently the Big 12's leading scorer as well and ranked among the top 10 nationally with her 22.5 points per outing, placing her sixth in the country.

Cowgirls Move Into Uncharted Top 25 Waters

For the first time in over a decade, the Cowgirls moved into the national rankings after earning a spot in the Associated Press' Week Four poll. OSU also made history in the Week 10 poll, moving up seven spots to No. 18, marking the program's highest-ever position before moving up four more spots in Week 11. The Cowgirls previous best was No. 19, which they held on two occasions in 1996. Week Five also saw OSU appear in the coaches' poll for the first time since February of 1996, coming in at No. 24. The Cowgirls have been ranked for 12 consecutive weeks in the Associated Press Poll, surpassing their previous best of 10 consecutive weeks during the 1995-96 season.

Non-Conference Success

OSU won all nine of its non-conference home games in each of the past two seasons and has won 23 consecutive games in Stillwater against non-league opponents. OSU's last home loss in non-conference action was a double-overtime setback against Tulsa on Dec. 3, 2005.

Cowgirls Ink Two During Fall Signing Period

Tegan Cunningham—Currently a sophomore at Seward County (Kan.) Community College, Cunningham became just the second freshman in school history to earn first-team NJCAA and WBCA All-America honors after averaging 18.1 points and 10.1 rebounds per game a year ago. In addition to being named a first-team All-Jayhawk West Conference selection, she was named the league's freshman of the year and most valuable player. *Kelsey Hatcher*—Hatcher averaged 14.8 points per game as a junior and set the school's single-season record for 3-pointers with 69, while leading the Lady Mustangs to their third consecutive state title. Ranked among the top 25 seniors nationally by the Collegiate Girls Basketball Report, Hatcher captured 10 combined state titles through her first three years, winning two basketball and three soccer team titles.

Hernandez's Debut One For The Books

It did not take long for freshman Kristin Hernandez to make a name for herself as a Cowgirl. The Dallas, Texas native finished as the squad's leading scorer with 25 points on a 9-of-10 shooting effort against Air Force in the season opener, marking the highest total by a freshman in the first game of the season. Overall, Hernandez's total ranks as the fourth-best total by a Cowgirl ever in the season opener. Hernandez's point total was also the most points in a game by an OSU freshman since Jennifer Crow scored 25 against Nicholls State in 1996.

Head Coach Kurt Budke

On March 28, 2005, Kurt Budke was named the sixth coach in the history of the Cowgirl basketball program. Since taking over the Allen County Community College program for the 1991-92 season, Budke has known nothing but success throughout his coaching endeavors. Having won 84 percent of his games as a college head coach, Budke led OSU to its first NCAA appearance in more than a decade last season as well as the nation's largest turnaround.

During a two-year stay at Allen County, Budke recorded a 47-15 record before beginning a remarkable run at Trinity Valley Community College. He made six national championship game appearances during his seven seasons with the Lady Cardinal program, winning four national titles during that time. A move to the Division I level and a two-year stint as associate head coach at Louisiana Tech followed. Budke took over the Tech program prior to the 2002-03 season and promptly led the Lady Techsters to a 31-3 record. In three seasons at Tech, he compiled a record of 80-16 while making NCAA Tournament appearances each season.
